

## The Europlat project

Europlat is an academic network project involving 32 partners from psychology departments in universities across Europe.

The main objective of the network is to enhance the quality of teaching and student learning in psychology by sharing good practices, working together to develop research projects and providing a forum for discussion with conferences and newsletters.\*

To reach these objectives, Europlat will be undertaking a number of activities over the first three years of the project based around an annual conference, website hub and spoke between the 32 partners, three research projects and an annual report outlining the latest innovative practices in psychology.



The three research projects are:

- 1. Innovative teaching methods within psychology education**
- 2. Employability of European graduates with a post Bologna Bachelor or Masters Degree in psychology**
- 3. Quality assurance initiatives to maintain standards**

Europlat is designed as a first step towards constituting a permanent virtual community, which helps psychology students and graduates across Europe.
